Wellbeing is the development of the capabilities necessary to thrive, contribute and respond positively to challenges and opportunities of life.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

Behaviour is communication. What 'need' is my child trying to express?

Behaviour is learned. "I need this. How can I get it? I'll try this. That worked. I'll do that again."

On Monday all of our staff from Inverloch and Kongwak Primary Schools engaged in a full day of Professional Learning around School Wide Positive Behaviour Support. The day was led by Susan McLaren, who is the Inner Gippsland SWPBS coach, and we are thrilled that she will be able to continue to support us on this journey. We learnt about the principles and science behind SWPBS, including why it works. We also a crash course in the essential features we will be implementing in order to get this happening in our school.

Throughout the day it was evident that at IKPS we have caring staff and great programs in place to support our students, their academic achievement and their wellbeing. Our school motto is 'We Give Our Best to be Our Best,' and as we expect of our students to continue to learn, grow and improve, so are we, as a staff, striving to learn, grow and improve. We are excited about getting curious about behaviour! The SWPBS framework will enable us to pull all of these programs together, add further supports, and target them more effectively in order to continue developing a positive and encouraging school culture.

Our first step will be putting together a team to lead the implementation of SWPBS at IKPS. Then we will be continuing our learning around SWPBS in our Professional Learning Communities. Through this work, staff and students will be developing a common language so that all students will have the knowledge of what is expected of them, have the skills to do so and see the natural benefits for acting responsibly.

We will continue to provide you with updates on this journey as the year progresses.

Judy's Mystery Bags are Back! (What are they?)



CCTV Installation

Due to vandalism, unhygienic and extremely unsafe behaviour outside school hours at Inverloch Primary School, we have decided to use a closed-circuit television (CCTV) system. A system will also be installed at Kongwak Primary School in response to the theft that occurred last year. The system will be used to record unacceptable behaviours to assist with identification and reporting to police.

Our school has an obligation to ensure the school environment is safe and secure, and fulfil our duty of care to students, staff and visitors. The CCTV system will assist our school to fulfil these obligations and to prevent and manage other inappropriate behaviour on school grounds. CCTV will also provide enhanced capability to protect our school's assets against vandalism and theft.

The strategic placement of stickers and signs will decrease incidents before they happen.

The systems at this stage will only operate out of school hours.

We will be following Department of Education and Training policy requirements for the design, installation, management and use of the CCTV systems.

The systems will be operational once policies have been presented to each of the School Councils. The CCTV Privacy Notice and CCTV policy will be posted on our school website once approved.

CAMP SCHOOL EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

camps, sports & excursions fund (csef) School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum. CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

As part of the funding Prep students will receive a uniform package and further information will be sent home regarding this once an application has been made.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form from the start of next year.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred: • new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year. • changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year. Please check with the school office if you are unsure.
