ANAPHYLAXIS

Inverloch and Kongwak Primary School's approach to anaphylaxis is a minimisation approach to have affected students be empowered, independent and careful with their allergies and reactions wherever they may be. At Kongwak we have a student with a severe allergy to peanuts and at Inverloch we have to be careful with egg, milk, peanuts, and sesame seeds. We also have students allergic to certain insects.

Our strategies include:

- \checkmark No casual sharing of food
- ✓ No food as rewards or reinforcements
- ✓ Treating backtrack and trees at Kongwak PS for jumping jacks
- ✓ Careful class cooking
- ✓ Teacher education through twice yearly briefings
- ✓ Encouraging washing of hands after eating common allergens such as milk, eggs and nuts
- ✓ Respectful classroom signage
- ✓ Observing and implementing DET anaphylaxis requirements






Judy's Mystery Bags are Back! (What are they?)

CCTV Installation

Due to vandalism, unhygienic and extremely unsafe behaviour outside school hours at Inverloch Primary School, we have decided to use a closed-circuit television (CCTV) system. A system will also be installed at Kongwak Primary School in response to the theft that occurred last year. The system will be used to record unacceptable behaviours to assist with identification and reporting to police.

Our school has an obligation to ensure the school environment is safe and secure, and fulfil our duty of care to students, staff and visitors. The CCTV system will assist our school to fulfil these obligations and to prevent and manage other inappropriate behaviour on school grounds. CCTV will also provide enhanced capability to protect our school's assets against vandalism and theft.

The strategic placement of stickers and signs will decrease incidents before they happen.

The systems at this stage will only operate out of school hours.

We will be following Department of Education and Training policy requirements for the design, installation, management and use of the CCTV systems.

The systems will be operational once policies have been presented to each of the School Councils. The CCTV Privacy Notice and CCTV policy will be posted on our school website once approved.

CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

Conveyance Allowance is available for children who are attending their nearest government school (or in some circumstances your next nearest government school) and live 4.8km or more from the school. If you think this applies to you please collect an application form from the office. **These forms must be returned to school by 3rd March.** Parents who already receive this allowance do not need to reapply, but if your circumstances have changed you need to notify the office. If you have another child who has just started school, you will need to complete an application form for them.

Do you have a concession card? If so you may qualify for government funding!

CAMP SCHOOL EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum. CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a **valid means-tested concession card** or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

As part of the funding Prep students will receive a uniform package and further information will be sent home regarding this once an application has been made.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form from the start of next year.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred: • new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year. • changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year. Please check with the school office if you are unsure.
