School refusal can be such a difficult time to navigate and can be confronting when your child has appeared to be settled at school and suddenly grabs hold and says 'Don't leave, I don't want to go to school!' When looking at the Emotion Wheel and using it as a guide it can help to break down how your child might be thinking in the moment, it becomes easier to discuss the apparent upset to how they are really feeling. Rather than sad maybe they

are hurt, bleak, deflated, feeling melancholy about the day. With that understanding under your wing you also have a team of people here to support you and your child at school. We (Kate Eldred, Natasha Bird, Kerry Ware and myself) are here to help your child begin their day on a positive note. Whether that may be a quiet start to the day, a quick check-in throughout the day or creating a space that feels safe we can provide that for them. Harmony Day 2023

On Tuesday 21st of February it was Harmony Day. This day was the first day that we met in our Multi-Age Groups. These will be our Multi-Age Groups for this year. These groups will work together on Multi-Age days and at various other opportunities throughout the year. The aim is to further support the development of connections between students in our school. These groups will increase the number of connections that they have to others in our school, including a connection with another adult.

Connections matter. Strong ties with family, friends and the community provide us with happiness, security, support and a sense of purpose. Being connected to others is important for our mental and physical wellbeing and can be a protective factor against <u>anxiety</u> and <u>depression</u>.

During the session, students were supported in getting to know each other. Each group worked collaboratively to come up with a group name and logo. They discussed the meaning of 'Harmony' and what it means to celebrate our diversity. There was also a word challenge that was won by the "The Kool Kids" who were able to share some orange juice and fruits; orange being the colour for Harmony Day.

Whilst we encourage all students to look out for each other, we particularly want to encourage students to make a big effort to talk to, connect with, support/say hi to, the members of their Multi-Age Group.



On Tuesday 4th April , we will be having our Superheroes multiage day-our first for the year. This multiage day complements our current wellbeing curriculum focussing on personal strengths and wellbeing. Students are encouraged to be creative in developing their own character with its own super strength (e.g. hope, fairness, honesty, loyalty, resilience, generosity, persistence self control, humour, brave, courage, tolerance, compassion, creativity etc) or wellbeing strength (nutrition, sleep, active, resilience, fitness etc.) **No need** to buy anything-just use what you have at home (capes, masks, belts) or convert a superhero costume you already have.

For those new to our school community, Multiage days are when we celebrate an event or curriculum area by participating in a range of themed activities in mixed age groups.

Restorative Practices

The philosophy of Restorative Practice views relationships and people as the most important aspect of schools and communities. Schools embracing this philosophy prioritise building positive relationships, creating supportive learning environments, and establishing fair, democratic systems across their community. A restorative approach seeks to address the harm caused to people and relationships in the wake of mistake making, and repair that harm with those most affected.

Last Tuesday was a fantastic day of learning for all of our staff and Inverloch and Kongwak Primary Schools. We were very lucky to have the wonderful Kristy Elliott from Restorative Pathways lead us through an engaging day of training. Throughout the day we learnt about:

- What it means to have a restorative mindset
- Neuro-scientific and psychological foundations of restorative approaches
- Using restorative language, dialogue, & processes to repair harm in a range of settings This philosophy fits well with our commitment to School Wide Positive Behaviour Support. It gave us our reason 'Why!' With a strong evidence-based backing. We know that in order for students to learn best we must do 'WITH.' We need to continue creating an environment:
- Where behavioural expectations are clear
- Where students are taught what they need to do to create a positive environment and how to demonstrate these positive behaviours
- Where we support students with further learning when mistakes are made
- And we help them to learn how to repair the harm done to relationships when mistakes are made.






Artist of the Week
