
Charlie and the Chocolate Factory

SUSTAINABLE KONGWAK

Over the last few weeks we have been building our native bee hotels to put around the school. Our students have been drilling, screwing, painting, braiding and hanging in appropriate places. They will provide habitat and nesting places for our native bees.

We have also been having a look at nest box design for different animals. We use nest boxes because we don't have enough hollows due to the shortage of 100 year old trees and many of our native mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and insects rely on them for habitat. We had a short walk in Pioneer Reserve to have a look at natural hollows and some nest boxes installed by Kongwak Hills Landcare Group.


