

- It has been a pleasure to work with students on their **reading** goals this week, and celebrate lots of growth that students have had with their accuracy, fluency and understanding of what they read!
- We have continued our work on **writing** informative texts, and compared our Cold Write on an animal with our work earlier in the year. We can't believe how our skills and knowledge have grown!
- In **Maths** we have built our understanding of probability, making spinners which satisfied the criteria of:
- A number written in each section
- All sections equal
- The probability of the arrow landing on an even number as ⅓
- The probability of the arrow landing on a number above 40 as 50%



This challenged our thinking as we had to use trial and error to find a spinner which worked, and collaborate with others whilst we were persevering through challenges. Finding the expected outcomes (predicting what would happen) before spinning our spinner challenged us too!

## SUSTAINABLE KONGWAK

Did you know that a 600ml Big M has 57 grams (14 teaspoons) of sugar in it. The daily allowance for kids is recommended at 15g (4 teaspoons). Last week we had a look at the effects of too much sugar on our bodies, and measured how much sugar was in some of our daily dairy, sauces, sweets, drinks and serials. We then looked at food labels so we can compare different products and see how much sugar is in each item.

The seniors were asked to design a sustainable property and come up with some fantastic ideas of how to leave a smaller footprint on our environment.





During STEM, our students were asked to build a bridge with an unsupported 20 cm span which had to hold a weight without collapsing.









Today Eva & Louis cooked pasta with garlic, cheese, lemon, thyme and mushrooms. We used native bushfood thyme in recognition of the beginning of Reconciliation Week.
