Half of each ticket go into a weekly raffle, whilst the other half can be taken home so that students can continue discussions about their positive behaviours at home. Congratulations to Dahlia F, Ailee K, Marli S, Azarya. Archie R who were our raffle winners for this week.



Understand and accept that you get to choose your friends


Today at assembly we asked students to think about the question...
