




Our artist of the week is Rhona M in grade 1 with her "Bollywood Bird". Rhona has created a celebratory painting depicting a bird using colour.

# National Day of Action Against Bullying and Violence

#### FRIDAY AUGUST 18TH 2023

#### **CONNECTIONS**

The NDA theme for 2023 is 'growing connections'. This theme supports research findings that strong school community connections and social skills are protective factors in the prevention of bullying and help enable positive, help-seeking behaviours in students.

This week students have engaged in activities that supported students in understanding what connection means and help them to recognise the connections that they have in their lives.

#### **HELP SEEKING**

Alongside our current focus on friendship skills, students have also been focusing on the topic of Help-Seeking. This has been taught through the Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships learning materials. Learning activities in this topic area are designed to help students discuss the importance of seeking help and providing peer support when dealing with problems that are too big to solve alone. This helps to normalise and destigmatise help-seeking behaviour. Scenario-based activities help student identify situations in which help should be sought, identify trusted sources of help and practise seeking help from peers and adults. (Taken from the RRRR Introduction Booklet).

We encourage you to continue these conversations about connections and help-seeking at home. Some questions you may wish to ask your children are:

How do we know when a problem is/or is getting too large?

If the problem is too large, what can the person do?

What would you do if you sought help and got an unhelpful response?

Using the 'Helping Hand' below, work with your child to record the names of five trusted people that they can go to when they need help or are worried that a friend or family member needs help. Keep these displayed.

Lots of great activities are currently being planned to help us celebrate Book Week and the importance of reading, whilst we all have a lot of fun!








