Social Emotional Learning (SEL)

This week in SEL, students in Grades 3 – 6 have been learning about 'Trouble Talk' and what to do about it!

What is Trouble Talk?

- Telling untrue stories
- Spreading rumours
- Gossiping
- Saying mean or hurtful things
- Sharing information that is not yours to share

How to deal with Trouble Talk


- Don't join in
- Don't pass on or spread the rumours
- Change the subject
- Hang out with people who make you feel safe

Sometimes students will pass on something that someone has said that is unkind, but this is not helpful. A good friend would tell the person being unkind that what they are doing is not ok, or change the subject. They would NOT pass it on to the person it was about – that isn't necessary or helpful, and only makes the situation worse. If it was an ongoing problem, they would need to seek help from an adult.

Today at assembly we asked students to think about how they can stop the trouble talk and who they could seek help from in our school if this was something that was concerning them.

We encourage you to continue these conversations about positive friendship behaviours at home.





Our artist of the week is Ruby in grade 1 with her abstract art in mixed media of concentric circles. Ruby has used the colour wheel for her colour studies

I find it interesting that children have a clear favourite season when we chat about this in our Seasons for Growth program. For some it is summer because they love the beach and holidays and for others it's winter because they love reading books and drinking hot chocolate or playing particular sports. Have a chat with your children and ask them about their favourite season. Your children may surprise you!



I will continue to offer Seasons for Growth programs for small groups of students in years 3/4 and 5/6 in Term 4. Seasons for Growth strengthens the social and emotional wellbeing of children who have experienced significant change or loss in their lives. The program provides a safe learning environment for children where they can give

voice to their experiences, understand their feelings, learn skills that help them adapt, develop friendships and recognise 'I'm not the only one'. If you would like further information about having your child participate this term, please contact your child's class teacher or myself through the school.

BREAKFAST CLUB

It is delightful to greet students each Monday and Tuesday morning as they come and visit the volunteers from the Uniting Church who prepare and serve sandwiches and a drink at breakfast club diligently each week. Most mornings we serve over 70 children which keeps us busy from 8.30-9.00am. It is delightful that children are remembering to consistently use manners and be respectful.

The food is generously donated to the school by the Foodworks supermarket in Inverloch. The school is also provided with a box of fresh fruit from Foodworks Inverloch, which is distributed to children through classrooms. Please remind your children they are welcome to come and visit breakfast club if they need something extra to start their school day. Also, take the opportunity to say, "Thank you", when you visit our local supermarket and when you wander past our volunteers, if you have an opportunity.

All children who have been diagnosed with a medical condition including allergies, food/chemical intolerances, anaphylaxis, asthma, epilepsy will need to provide:

- a completed Medical Management Plan with a colour photo
- necessary medication

Please note it is a legal requirement under the Education & Care National Regulations and the Terms and Conditions for booking that these are provided.

In the interests of child safety, care may be refused on the day should the appropriate documentation or medication or medication not be supplied.



ndis Help for your child younger than 9

If you have concerns about your child's development, we can connect you to the right supports

Our early childhood approach helps children younger than 6 with developmental delay or children younger than 9 with disability, and their families, to access the right support when they need it.

It's about giving children and their families, supports so children can have the best possible start in life.

Your child doesn't need a diagnosis to get help

Children younger than 6 do not need a diagnosis to get support through our early childhood approach.

If you have concerns about your child's development, talking to a professional who knows your child best is a good place to start. This could be your child's doctor, early childhood educator or child health nurse.

Concerns about your child's development might include how they:

- play and move around
- do things to take care of themselves
- socialise with other children
- communicate what they want.

Compared with other children their own age.

After talking with your child's health or education professional our early childhood partners can help connect you and your child to the right supports.

Our early childhood partners deliver our approach

Early childhood partners are local organisations we fund to deliver the early childhood approach. Our early childhood partners have professional teams with experience and clinical expertise to work with young children with developmental delay or disability and their families. Your local early childhood partner will:

- work with you to understand your child's needs
- recommend what early connections are best for your child.

Early connections support your child regardless of NDIS eligibility

Early connections will make sure you get the right supports and services for your child's individual needs.

They could be things like valuable information, connecting you to community and other government services, early supports or help to apply to the NDIS.

Early supports build you and your child's capacity

Early supports work to build you and your child's capacity to promote everyday learning in your home and other community environments.





Apply to the NDIS

If your child has a <u>developmental delay</u> or a disability your early childhood partner can support you to put together information and evidence to help work out if your child is eligible to apply for the NDIS. If your child transitions from early connections to become an NDIS participant, then your early childhood partner will work with you to develop your child's NDIS plan.
