<u>Junior & Senior Maths Game :</u> Salute

Preps to 6's have been playing the game Salute.

HOW TO PLAY: between 3 people you need 1 pile of cards then split into 2 piles. 2 people are going to get a card and say 1,2,3 Salute and then hold the card to their head where they can't see. The third person looks at both of the cards and adds them up if you're in prep and 1 (but 2 to 6 they will multiply it). The 2 people with the cards guess the number on their card by looking at each other's card and what the third person said it equals.

Eg: Your opponent has the number 2 and the third person says it adds up to 7 your card must be 5 since the other has 2 or for multiplication the third person would say it is 10 and then you would try figure out your card is 5 before the other figures their card out which is 2 for this example. Whoever says the answer to their card first wins! You can keep playing for as long as you like.
