Helpful?, is it Inspiring?, is it Necessary? and is it Kind?


THINK before you speak T is it. TRUE? H is it. HELPFUL? I is it. INSPIRING? N is it. NECESSARY? K is it. KIND?

SWPBS-SNITCHING OR REPORTING?

Over the last term, we have heard a new word enter our school vocabulary. This word is **SNITCH-ING.**


The word has been causing us a few problems at school because it's stopping people from getting help when they need it. Part of the reason that it's been causing problems is because people have been using the word incorrectly. Some other words for snitching are dobbing or telling tales. This is when you try to get someone **into trouble.**

This is very different from **REPORTING.** As a member of our school community, we all have a responsibility to report something that is causing trouble for ourselves or another person. Reporting is being an upstander and we do it to get ourselves or others **out of trouble**.

We have done a lot of learning at school about the different types of problems and how we should respond to them. We have learnt about ant problems (little problems that we can usually solve ourselves) and elephant problems (big problems that require an adult). Below, you can see our IKPS Five Finger Plan, which we use to solve problems at school.

We acknowledge that children can sometimes feel worried about speaking up, but we need them to be courageous! We want to create a safe, happy and productive environment for all, and this can only be done if we address problems as they arise. Over the next week, we are going to be talking about who we can go to, and how we can do this discreetly if we want to remain anonymous.

On Wednesday and Thursday this week the Grade 5 and 6 students participated in an education session ran by Life Saving Victoria. The sessions included gaining knowledge to keep safe when in and around water, especially in the ocean. Students were taught to identifying dangers like rip currents and how safety signs can help us to be safe.

When in the water, students learned survival strategies when wearing a lifejacket, and practising important survival techniques -including the huddle, the HELP position and safely entering and exiting the water.

They also learned everyday lifesaver skills like the emergency response sequence and DRSA-BCD.

Students practiced rescue strategies using everyday items that may be available like rescue tubes, towels, ropes and even bike helmets. Learning how to use body boards safely was definitely a highlight!













Students in 3J have been learning about 3D shapes and their properties. Today they had fun building the shapes and writing on the tables.

The Hub hopes this will be helpful for the families who want to visit the beautiful work the students have done.




ARTIST OF THE WEEK




Would you like to learn Ukulele Can you help me make a video clip? It's free. It's fun.
