



NestBox Project

We have been successful in applying for a Landcare Biodiversity Grant will has allowed us to buy 52 nest boxes for bats, gliders, possums, and a variety of birds. The Kongwak kids will assemble, pick trees, and help install the nest boxes in Pioneer Reserve and the school grounds. We will then be able to monitor the nest boxes over the coming years using nest box cameras.


