

Conveyance Allowance is available for children who are attending their nearest government school (or in some circumstances your next nearest government school) and live 4.8km or more from the school. If you think this applies to you please collect an application form from the office. **These forms must be returned to school by 8th March.** Parents who already receive this allowance do not need to reapply, but if your circumstances have changed you need to notify the office. If you have another child who has just started school, you will need to complete an application form for them.

Ant and Elephant Problems and the Five Finger Plan


This week, in our Schoolwide Positive Behaviour lessons, we have been focussing on the size of the problem. We use the language of 'Ant' and 'Elephant' problems.

An 'Ant Problem' is something that you can usually solve yourself and doesn't cause you any danger. The '5 Finger Plan' can be used to try to solve 'Ant' problems independently.

An 'Elephant Problem' is too hard or too risky to solve on your own. An elephant problem is something that makes you feel hurt, scared or unsafe. An adult is required to help solve this type of problem.

Over the week, we have learnt to identify the difference between 'Ant' and 'Elephant' problems to determine the best response. It would be great if you could revisit the 'Five Finger Plan' at home too!

What do we do if we have a problem?




Celebrating International Women's Day at IKPS
