Running to Paris update

The students have been enjoying their 5 minutes of moving around the oval we averaged 63 laps each day this week with a total over 700 laps this term. This puts us virtually running over the ocean (which sparked a lot of questions about how we got over the water) and we are somewhere between Broome and Indonesia.

In the Senior Room....

The senior room has been studying Migration to Australia- why did people come to Australia? The students have been asked to share stories about why their family came here-there are some very interesting reasons.

We are combining several areas of the curriculum and have been looking at synthesising while learning about the history of Australia and are getting ready to write an informative piece about a moment in Australian history.

We have learned about the potato famine, highland clearances and blackbirding and the effects they had on the population makeup of Australia. There have been discussions about how not all migrations were willing or fair and the effect it has had on the aboriginal communities, but we learn from the past to ensure we don't repeat the mistakes.

This week we focused on the rush to the gold fields, playing a game where they discovered the hardships they endured as well as doing reading comprehension about the gold finds.

In maths we are practising our problem solving, with a focus this week on how to work out sums and our multiplication- it would be great if you can get the kids to practise their times tables at home, in the car or anytime you can.

Information Report - By the Junior Class

WOMBATS



Wombats are marsupials.

Look Like

Wombats have black wet noses. They have grey, black and brown fur. It is short and wiry. Their legs are short and stubby, but they can run really fast if they need to! They can run up to 20 km per hour. Wombats have sharp claws used for digging.

Habitat

Wombats live in grassland all over Australia. They live in burrows that they dig with their claws. And they burrow under trees.

Do

Wombats like running and eating. They sleep during the day and wake up at night.

POO

Wombats do square shaped poo. Their bodies are made differently so they do square shaped poo. Why is it square? Because it marks their territory.

Predators

Wombats' predators are crocodiles and dingoes. Baby wombats need to be careful of eagles.

Food

Wombats eat grass, bark, roots and carrots. Wombats find their food by using their noses to smell, claws to dig and teeth to eat.

Mummies and Babies

They have pouches that face backwards. Babies are called joeys. When the babies are born, they drink milk. The baby lies in the mothers pouch until they can walk.
