



#### **IKPS ARE WALKING FOR RECONCILIATION- JOIN US!**

On Monday the 3rd of June, IKPS will be celebrating Reconciliation Week. We will have a multiage morning to learn what Reconciliation Week is all about, and then at 2:30pm, the whole school will participate in a walk for reconciliation. All members of our community are welcome to join us. Details of the route that we will follow will be shared in the next newsletter and through Compass. Why walk for reconciliation?

You have probably heard the phrase 'walking together' being used when discussing reconciliation. On the 28th of May in the year 2000, The Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation came up with the idea to have a mass walk across Sydney Harbour Bridge to promote reconciliation. The organisers did not expect a big turn out, but about 250 000 Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people showed up to walk together across Sydney Harbour Bridge. A week later, 60 000 people walked together across the William Jolly Bridge in Brisbane; and then 300 000 people walked from Flinders Street Station in Melbourne to Kings Domain.

When we walk together, we acknowledge that we all have a role to play when it comes to reconciliation.

We have also been working on our multiplication and division, noting how connected they are. I'd love it if the students could practise their times tables at home, to help them become automatic to them, without them needing to count it up each time.

Students have been working on different types of information reports and are currently working on a topic of their choice. We have been working on efficient searching on Google to help us find answers to our questions.





### MARC Preview of Learning – Term 2 2024

MARC Library teaching sessions support the love of literature, knowledge and understanding of how books 'work' and the features of picture fiction, fiction and non-fiction books.

In our teaching sessions we choose books according to themes, ideas, units of learning, problem solving and enjoyment.

Of course, one of the highlights of a MARC session is going into the van to choose a book. What will I find? What will I read? Students love to browse and discuss their choice with other students. They question as to whether a particular book is available and also enlighten us to the fact that a certain book has been published and maybe we should purchase it.

Students can borrow a book for two weeks and then return and borrow another two. We have a number of books overdue at this point in time. If your child has an overdue book could you please help your child/children to locate and return books. They are labelled and have a distinctive green dot on the spine. Thank you.
