# IKPS WALK ABOUT TOWN FOR RECONCILIATION

At IKPS, we hold a multi-age event at least once a term to help build connections across the school. The students have been allocated a multi-age group which they remain in for the whole year.

On Monday, we had a multi-age event to learn about Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week.

During Session One and Session Two, the children broke up into their multi-age groups and watched a video together to learn about the significance of Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week. They then worked in groups of 4 or 5 to develop posters displaying messages of reconciliation. It was so wonderful walking around the classes and seeing the children engaging in circle time and collaborative learning. The grade 5's (as usual) were so supportive of their Prep buddies. We walked around the perimeter of the Rec Reserve and then onto the oval where the whole school joined in singing this year's reconciliation song 'Black Fella, White Fella'.

The children sang so beautifully.
